Tobacco Prevention Quarter Update	<p>Point of Sale Task Force: Kim and Jennifer A. are working on meeting with commissioners to educate them on the Counter Tools project data. The partnership requested that they also receive an update on ENDS regulations, which the commissioners have also requested. Jackie volunteered to join the meeting with commissioners.</p> <p>Smokeless Tobacco: The Martin County Fair is currently happening and recognizing Through With Chew Week. SWAT Youth are also attending to distribute TWCW information. The fair is tobacco free with smoking zones off the fairway. The partnership is looking for future events to work with for tobacco free policies, including Artsfest next year.</p> <p>SFMUH: Sanctuary at Stuart is opening soon and will be a tobacco free housing complex. Many new residencies that are opening are opening as tobacco free facilities. Work continues to be done with HUD housing through the county, but because the facilities are individually owned and contracted those efforts are slower moving. Stuart PHA is a tobacco free HUD housing facility. Sandhill Cove reported the cost of rehabilitating one of their units that was previously occupied by a smoker at \$15,000.</p> <p>Tobacco Free Worksites: Jessica from AHEC will be attending the Awareness Technologies workplace wellness fair on March 2. Palm City Millwork, Construction Journal and Martin County are all considering tobacco free workplace policies. Partnership updates:

- Dr. Hummel announced that Charlie Nail, a longtime partnership members and advocate passed away on Sunday. Mike has funding at the Boys & Girls Clubs to plant a memorial tree in Indiantown to be planted in his honor. Dr. Hummel shared information on his accomplishments and the service for those who wish to attend.
- QuitDoc Foundation has been invited to speak at a conference in Texas and is running a pilot program in Marion County for youth tobacco cessation, which incorporates adults in the homes who smoke, smokeless tobacco use and ENDS use.
- Keep Martin Beautiful has applied for a grant for high-tech tobacco receptacles to be placed in parks in the community. They will find out in March if they receive the grant.
- Dr. Hummel recommended we reach out to restaurants about having family friendly tobacco free nights on outdoor patios at restaurants. We'd like to find restaurants in Martin County that will do this.
